Saddened LBJ **Postpones His** Trip to Honolulu

WASHINGTON (UPI)-President Johnson Thursday night, in a nation-wide Radio-TV address from the White House, postponed until Friday his trip to Hono-lulu, Hawaii, because of the death of Dr. Martin Luther

"America is shocked and saddened by the brutal slaying tonight of Dr. Martin Luther King, I ask every citizen to stay away from the violence that struck Dr. King,"

Storms Kill 18 in U.S.

Freezing air and bitter, strong winds lashed the Midwest Thursday as a savage snow and wind storm which left 18 dead from Nebraska to Kentucky pushed across the northern Great Lakes.

Readings fell to the freezing mark in 11 states from the Great Plains to northern Missis-sippi, Snow fell in Iowa, Minnesota, Michigan and the Dakotas.

Winds whipping at 30 to 50 miles an hour crossed the Great Lakes and turned toward the Mid-Atlantic States. Saginaw, Mich., recorded wind gusts of 67 miles an hour.

Freeze warnings accompanied flash flood threats in the lower Mississippi Valley where the thunderstorms and tornadoes of Wednesday night were followed by heavy rains.

A tornado struck the high school at Muscle Shoals, Ala., Thursday causing \$25,000 dam-(Continued on Back Page, Col. 3)

A U.S. spokesman said he ex-pected some of the Operation Pegasus relief force to link up with the 6,000 Marines inside Khe Sanh possibly by nightfall. (United Press International

(United Press International said a battalion of Marines

pushed 1.5 miles out of Khe Sanh Thursday and seized Hill 771 to the south. The Marines reported finding 20 dead North Vietnamese, most of them be-lieved killed by U.S. artillery

The three-pronged American relief force of Marines and heli-copter-borne cavalrymen was pushing toward the base from the east, north and south. Reports said they were encountering sporadic artillery and mortar fire but little resistance at heavile.

A company of 3rd Div. Ma-rines was spearheading the as-sault. They were closing in from the northwest above the base and were about a half-mile from the barbed wire per-(Continued on Back Page, Col. 1)

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) - Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., 1964 Nobel Peace Prize winner and America's leading exponent of non-violence in the civil rights struggle, was shot to death Thursday night, Asst. Police Chief Henry Lux said.

Two unidentified men were arrested several blocks from where King was shot while standing on a motel balcony.

The Rev. Andrew Young, executive vice president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference headed by King, said the shot hit King in the neck and lower right part of his face.

"He didn't say a word, he didn't move," Young

Immediately after the shooting, the civil rights leader was rushed to St. Joseph's Hospital where he was declared dead a short

time later. "Martin Luther King is

"Martin Luther King is dead," Lux said.
Riffe-armed police blocked the front entrances to the hospital to hold back a crowd which gathered quickly.
King came to Memphis Wednesday to take charge

of continuing demonstrations in support of the city's 1,300 striksupport of the City's 1,500 strik-ing garbage collectors. A march led by King last Thursday erupt-ed into rioting in which one per-son was killed. Another march had been planned.

National Guard troops rushed to Memphis to quell last week's riot but were pulled out Wednes-

riot but were pulled out Wednes-day night.
Gov. Buford Ellington ordered
4,000 National Guard troops into
Memphis. A curfew was
clamped on the city.
Young said he and other mem-bers of King's staff were stand-ing by a car in front of the
motel when King walked to the
balcony of his second-floor room.
King's doath came only a sight

King's death came only a night after he told associates that he was not disturbed by reports that he would be subjected to physical harm while in Memphis. "He said he had reached the pinnacle of fulfillment with his nonviolent movement." Young

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
